

### Delivery and pick-up regulations for suppliers

#### **Foreword**

In order to ensure an interference-free storage, it is essential to comply with and observe the delivery and labelling terms and conditions described below.



#### Delivery and pick-up regulations for suppliers

#### 1 Field of application

The delivery regulations shall apply to all incoming production materials (incl. packaging material, bulky goods) as well as to all sales articles (finished products, trading goods). Exceptions or deviations are only possible after written approval by the responsible Jean&Len employee.

#### 2 Delivery times

Mon - Fri 7:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. Delivery at other times only after coordination with the incoming goods department (Tel. +49(0)7552 / 92800-641)

#### 3 Avis

The delivery is to be announced at least 1 day in advance by email (advice note) to the email address <u>Wareneingang@jeanlen.de</u> by stating the following information:

- Delivery Note
- Date of delivery
- Time of delivery
- Article number
- Delivered quantity (number of pallets + number of items per article)
- Place of delivery/pick-up

#### 4 Form of delivery and pick-up

#### 4.1 Transport securing

To ensure damage-free transport, it is necessary to secure the goods on the load carriers (pallets). To protect the goods from soiling and instability, it is essential to stretch or wrap them in transparent film as well as to cover the pallets with film.

When wrapping pallets, care must be taken to ensure that industrial trucks can easily pick up and transport the pallet. The skid clearances of the pallets must not be covered with film and the composite wrap may only extend approx. 2 cm over the pallet wood.

The beginning and end of the film must not be wrapped around the pallet block. In addition, no film ends or stickers may stick out. No intermediate layers of corrugated cardboard or film may be used, neither between the pallet and the first layer nor between the other layers.






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#### 4.2 Packing scheme

Ensure that the layers are even and stable. The same number of packaging units must be packed on each layer. To increase stability, the individual cardboard boxes should be packed in a bundle. This prevents the layers underneath from being damaged by the weight of the layer itself. The height of the cartons must be the same for all cartons, they must not protrude. The surface of the layer must be even, the packaging units must not be crushed.



The maximum pallet height of 105 cm (including pallet) must be adhered to; higher pallets may only be delivered by arrangement. The cardboard boxes must not protrude on any side of the pallet.

Only pallets containing the same items and batches may be delivered.

The packing scheme may not be changed without prior agreement, as only one packing scheme is accepted per article number. In the event of a change, data such as article number and EAN must also be changed in advance.



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#### 4.3 Outer box

Ensure that the adhesive material is of good quality and that the outer cartons do not open on their own

The outer carton must be labeled with the PU EAN, PU quantity, article number, article description and batch.

The supplier is also responsible for providing the outer carton with a dangerous goods label in accordance with chapter 3.4 ADR, if this is necessary for the article (results from table 3.2 A, column 7a ADR). Accordingly, the directional arrows must also be placed on two opposite sides.









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#### 4.4 Delivery quantity

The delivered goods as well as their packaging must be clean and undamaged. An excessive or shortfall in delivery of a max. of 5% are permitted.

#### 4.5 Unloading the lorries

The lorries are unloaded by the driver of the transport service provider with the support of a Jean&Len employee. Electric pallet trucks are provided for this purpose. For this reason, the lorry driver is obliged to wear closed safety shoes and a high-visibility waistcoat.

#### 4.6 Pallet exchange

Deliveries must generally be made on Euro wooden pallets according to DIN EN 13698-1. Alternatively, after consultation with Jean&Len Purchasing, deliveries can also be made in pallet cages, containers, on disposable pallets or as parcels.

The following conditions apply to deliveries on wooden pallets:

- The exchange shall be made exclusively in quality A or B (according to the quality classification for the open pallet exchange pool, which is available for download on the websites of GS1 Germany GmbH and EPAL/ Gütegemeinschaft Paletten e.V.).



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## **EPAL QUALITY CLASSIFICATION**

Recommendations for the use and exchange of EPAL Euro pallets

If there is no agreement to use the EPAL Quality Classification, only the EPAL Terms of Exchange apply (unrestricted exchangeability of new and used EPAL Euro pallets of classes A, 8 and C).

#### NEW

#### Characteristics: - ISPM 15 / IPPC

- 1,500 kg max, 22% residual maisture content

#### EPAL marking on all 4 comer blocks. nail positioning. No signs of use, light-coloured wood. All bottom boards are chamfered on both sides

All 4 corners of the pallet are chamfered at an angle of 45°.

# MCH-SUITABILITY OF

#### CLASS A

## Characteristics: - pallet has already been used - mainly light coloured - NOTI: Lightness alone is not a guarantee of a particular quality class. The criteria for the other classes must also

always be checked. surface moisture due to use/environment is permitted

No adhesions e.g. cardboard, foil, tapes, labels. Some residue permitted.

Signs of use. No dirt or contamination which may be transferred to the payload.



<u>Characteristics:</u>
- pallet has already been used
- mainly dark coloured

At least one EPAL marking must be legible on each side. No adhesions e.g. cardboard, foil, tapes, labels. Some residue permitted.

Signs of use. No dirt or contamination which may be transferred to the payload.

Inspection criteria: No twicted blocks, fork clearance, legs firmly attached.



#### CLASS C

## Characteristics: - pallet has already been used

mainly dark coloured surface moisture due to use / environment is permitted

Adhecions, e.g. cardboard, foil, tapes, labels permitted. After removal, a higher classification is possible.

Signs of heavy use. No dirt or contamination which may be transferred to the payload.

Slightly twisted blacks

MOTE, Max. 1 nail shank vioble per component, in total max. 2 nail shanks per pallet.
The nail tips must not be vioble or exposed.

At least one EPAL marking must be legible on each side.

Some splitting permitted in the wood.

#### NOT FIT FOR USE

According to the EPAL Terms of Exchange, EPAL Euro pallets are not exchangeable if damage or faults result in loss of usability.

usability are shown here and in the EPAL Terms of Exchange.

Restoration of exchangeability

To rectore exchangeability, damaged EPAL Euro pallets must be repaired by an EPAL-licensed repair company.









UNSORTED

Mixed pallets of all kinds, which are exchanged one-to-one by market players.

Criteria and permitted mix are agreed individually by the exchange/contractual partners.





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
## EPAL TERMS OF EXCHANGE Conditions for exchanging EPAL Euro pallets

The EPAL Serms of Exchange are binding.

EPAL Euro polints are exchangeable if there is no significant change or any faults that result in loss of unability.

Damage or Sudos that result is loss of studiety after result in loss of exchangeability.

The EPAL Terms of Exchange can be appliemented by the EPAL Quality Classification whereby the companies involved in the exchange, parthese or supply of EPAL Euro pallets maturally agree to use the EPAL Quality Classification as well as to exchange or supply EPAL Euro pallets of a specific class.



Further criteria for loss of exchangeability:

The load bearing capacity is no longer guaranteed (e.g. notion or decayed branch, severe brankage or splits). Some components are obviously unacceptable (e.g. boards too thin, blocks too narrow). Several blocks each bit severe brankages or splits.

Severe colling of the pafer your lead to contamination of the payload.

Restoration of exchangeability

To rettine unchangeability, damaged EPAL Euro pallets must be repaired by an EPAL-Europed repair company. A filst of EPAL-Europed repair companies is available on the EPAL website (www.apal.eu | Europea search).





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#### 5 Damage to the goods

In case of damages Jean&Len reserves the right to reject the delivered goods, if applicable, damages shall be asserted by means of a debit note against the supplier.

#### 6 Delivery documents

It is absolutely essential that the delivery documents contain the following details:

- Delivery address
- Supplier
- Supplier-delivery note number
- Supplier article number
- Jean&Len supplier number
- Jean&Len order number
- Jean&Len article number
- Batch number
- Best before date
- Total delivery quantity and delivery quantity divided according to load carriers (e.g. 3 pallets of 100 kg and 1 pallet of 75 kg)

Furthermore, the details on the delivery note must correspond with the details on the load carrier labelling.

The delivery documents are to be affixed externally on the goods, in a visible and transportsafe manner.

#### 7 Penalties

Jean&Len reserves the right to reject goods which do not comply with the stated delivery and labelling regulations, or to deduct necessary reworking upon acceptance in full from the invoice amount upon acceptance (at least EUR 50.00 per pallet).
